## **Points of interest**

Sheringham is a traditional seaside town, which grew up out of the old fishing village. Boats still bring in the daily catch. The town is home to the North Norfolk Railway (The Poppy Line), which operates steam train rides to Holt.





The Museum tells the story of the town and its people over the last two centuries. There are a rich variety of photographs, social history, agricultural and fishing artefacts, as well as a spectacular fleet of boats.



This out and back walk is approximately 1.16km along Sheringham promenade, giving you the opportunity to take in the sea and the beach, Sheringham town, beach huts and Sheringham museum. This walk has a long slope at the seafront.

This walk has features designed to be accessible for people living with dementia:

- Flat hard surfaces underfoot, slight slope to promenade
- Wide walkways
- Regular Seating during route
- No steps
- Refreshments at start point and throughout route
- Toilets at start and during the route
- Parking 20 metres from starting point, disabled bays, pay & display

Using our senses when we walk can help us connect with the world, jog our memory, and spark a conversation. Can you use all your senses on this walk? Here are some examples:


- **Listen:** Can you hear any birds? What do they sound like?

- Touch: Stop and touch something on your walk. Is it hard or soft? Rough or smooth? Warm or cold?




